



EVANGELICAL SEMINARY OF PUERTO RICO ACADEMIC PROGRESS POLICY

The Evangelical Seminary of Puerto Rico requires all students demonstrate satisfactory academic progress at the end of each academic year. Such progress will be determined by:

- The academic index GPA
- The relationship between the number of enrollment credits and approvals.
- The maximum time to complete the degree.

A. The academic index GPA Requirements:

The master student must maintain a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.50 to finish the degree.

B. Requirements credits in relation to enrollment credits:

Every student of Masters Programs must pass at least 50 percent of enrollment credits.

- **Enrollment credits** – shall be considered as enrollment credits, credits of courses in which the grades and notes obtained A, B, C, F, P, NP, I, W, TR
- **Credits Approved** - are considered as approved academic credits courses in which grades are obtained A, B, C, P, TR

EVALUATION OF ACADEMIC PROGRESS

At the end of the academic year in May, cases of students who do not meet standards of academic progress will be assessed. The courses in the summer sessions may be used to correct deficiencies in GPA and credits this year. Credits courses taken in the summer will be counted as additional studies. The student status will be reevaluated prior to enrollment of August.

All students whose academic progress are not in accordance with that established in subparagraphs (both?) A and B Policies of Student Progress will be placed on academic probationary status for two academic semesters (one year?). The academic load for students, who are on probation (because of subparagraph B), will be in an upcoming study period of the maximum allowable credits for regular students.

A student the at the end of the probationary period does not meet the requirements of subparagraphs A and B, will be withdraw from their academic program due to deficient in of academic progress for a period of one semester. However, a student during the probationary period, pass at least 75 percent of enrollment credits with a minimum GPA of 2.00 (GPA) in all completed courses may continue their studies in a probationary status.

Ending this period of suspension, the student may be readmitted to the Seminary in academic probationary status for two semesters. However, all students who have been dropped twice for academic reasons will be permanently suspended from the program in which they were registered.
